**Fee payment.** As allowed by Kansas state statutes 72-5390 and 72-5389, fees will be collected at the beginning of each school year, or at the time of enrollment for students transferring into the district midyear. Online payments are available through the school district website and are subject to a convenience fee of \$3.00 per transaction. Once paid, fees are in effect throughout the school year and are not refundable. There will be a \$30 fee charged on all returned checks.

**Fee waivers.** Assistance is available for students qualifying for the free or reduced lunch program. This is determined based on size of household and gross income and is subject to state qualification. Students qualifying for free lunch will receive a complete (100%) waiver of the instructional supply fee; students qualifying for reduced lunch will receive a partial (50%) waiver for the instructional supply fee. All other district fees will be assessed to all students at the full amount. There is no family cap on fees. Payment plans are available; contact Marj Spence, finance clerk, at 785-542-4910 for more information.

Parents wishing to apply for free/reduced lunch status must complete a Child Nutrition Program application and Waiver of Confidentiality, available during the enrollment period and from any school office. For more information about your eligibility, contact any school office and apply when you enroll for fall. Appeals for a denial of waiver will be handled according to the free/reduced lunch program appeal process.

<b>Other fees.</b> <i>These apply to programs or opportunities that are limited by space; advance permission or registration is required.</i>	
<b>Quest after-school program</b> <i>Students in kindergarten through 5th grade.</i>	<b>\$1,300 per year or \$130 per month. Cap of \$2,100 per family.</b>
<b>The ZONE after-school program</b> <i>Students in grades 6-8.</i>	<b>\$100 per year or \$50 per semester. Cap of \$200 per family.</b>
<b>Out-of-district enrollment</b> <i>Required for students living in another district choosing to attend Eudora Schools.</i>	<b>An annual fee of \$100 per student, or as outlined in Board Policy JBC, is required at the time of application. No fee waivers are available.</b>
<b>Driver education (summer)</b>	<b>\$225 per student, due at the time of driver education enrollment in the spring. No fee waivers are available.</b>
